



### Asahigaoka Park 🐘

In 1728, two elephants were sent from Vietnam to Nagasaki and presented to the 8th shogun, Tokugawa Yoshimune. They were raised in this park. The elephant tusk is placed in Hosen-ji Temple.

### Isimori Flour Mill

The large millstone in front of the head office was actually used in the past. Like the Millstone Monument at Hōsen-ji Temple, it serves as evidence that flour milling of wheat and buckwheat was once thriving in Nakano during the Edo period.

Three storied pagoda of Hosenji built in 1636 in the early Edo period. That pagoda is so famous that it was depicted in “Edomeisyozue” by Hirosige Utagawa.

However it was burned entirely by Great Tokyo Air Raid in 1945, therefore the location has changed from where the three-story pagoda was originally located. In February 2014, it was recognized as a sightseeing resource authorized by Nakano City.
